

Courses being offered: Intro to Lay Ministry Basic Course Instructor: Pastor Brian Boley

This course is for persons discerning a call to proclaim the presence and power of God through Lay Servant Ministries. Basic principles of proclaiming the Word of God through worship leadership, preaching, witnessing, teaching, leadership, and service form the framework for the class. This class will include leading a 5-10 minute devotion during the afternoon. There will be a precourse preparation sheet sent along with the course book when you register. This course is foundational for all courses in Lay Servant Ministries. Participants are encouraged to discover and employ personal spiritual gifts as God intended and to consider the importance of exercising servant leadership, developing future leaders, remaining rooted in consistent spiritual practices, and being part of a group that holds members accountable in their discipleship.

To keep your certificate current an advanced course is needed every three years.

This course may challenge some of your assumptions, test some of your preconceived ideas, stretch your thinking, and enrich your prayer life. It will, at the very least, present you with an opportunity to grow in the discipline of leading public prayer.

Living as United Methodist Christians Instructor: Rev. Mark Smith

This course will explore the special gifts of theology, witness, and organization that The United Methodist Church brings to the church universal, how we got where we are today, and how our distinctive emphases are still needed in the 21st-century church.

Caring for Those Who Grieve Instructor: Rev. Brian Seders

This course helps participants understand grief and effective ways of caring for those who experience various losses, including death of loved ones, employment loss, family changes, and relocation.
